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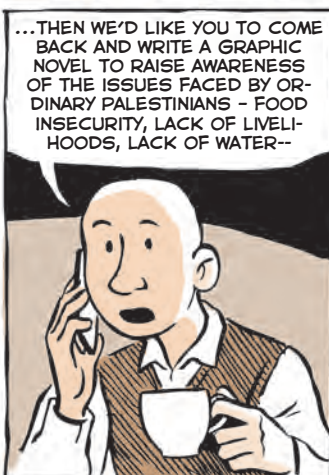
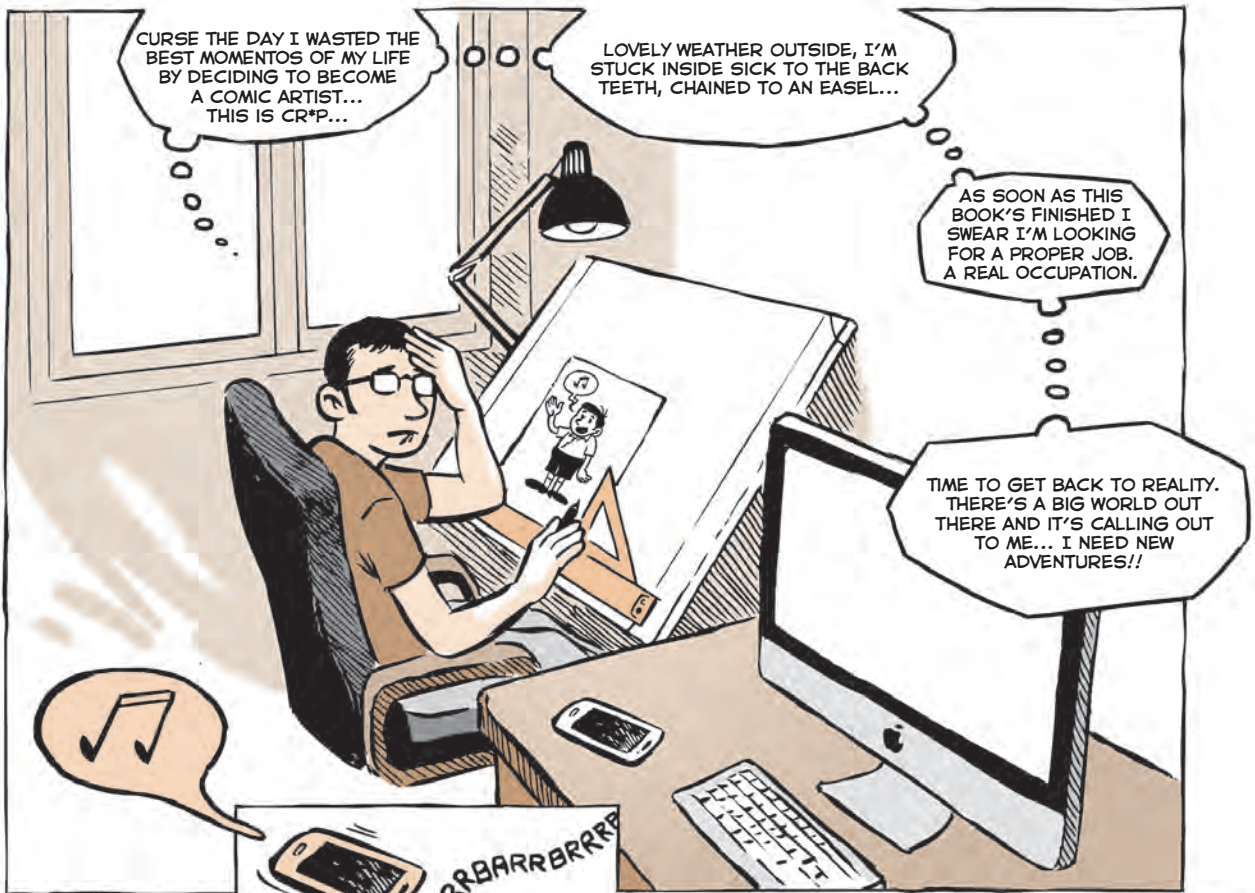
After several decades, the Israeli-Palestinian conflict is viewed as a frozen conflict, a history of hatred spanning over a hundred years. The path to nowhere twists this way and that depending on whoever is in the White House or in Israeli parliament, with no resolution in sight. We tend to oversimplify the narrative by talking of a Wall, which is much like all those other Walls that appear at many points in history. Or we report on the fierce clashes between the military and radical groups – stories that make a frequent appearance on the front pages. The reality is far more vivid and cruel: the victims, many of whom are young people and children, are suffering a drawn-out agony every day.

We wanted to offer a fresh perspective on 50 years of occupation in Palestine; to look at its effects on the ordinary lives of over 4 million people. 'Life under Occupation' focuses on the impact the conflict has had on access to clean water and on the livelihoods of Palestinians.

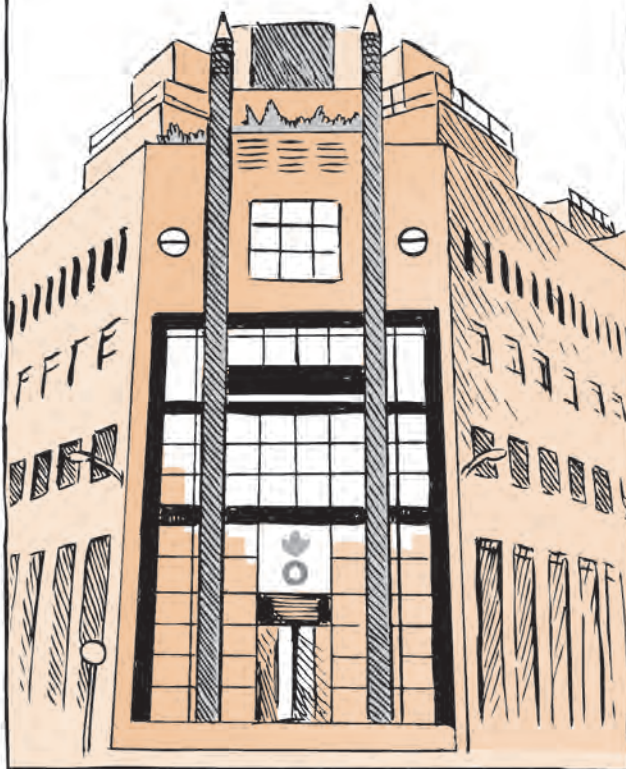
These difficulties should not have arisen, given the protections afforded by International Humanitarian Law (IHL). We have no desire to point fingers at anyone. We simply gather evidence and facts, and bear witness to what the occupation has entailed for the most vulnerable sectors of the population. Our work is made possible thanks to the support of institutions such as the Spanish Agency for International Development Cooperation (AECID), ensuring that every person has access to clean water and food. This is our area of expertise and we achieve our goals in up to 50 countries day in, day out.

A graphic novel seems the best form to make a statement because it offers a powerful medium through which to offer our testimony. This story is the chronicle of a 10-day journey through the occupied Palestinian territory from Nablus to Gaza, from the pen of graphic novel artist José Pablo García. The irresistible combination of his youth and talent will undoubtedly connect with a readership of all ages and reveal to them the human side of those who suffer under the occupation. We write in defiance of the indifference which generates and sustains lifelong conflicts. We write with empathy for other human beings; empathy is the motivation behind all forms of solidarity. It requires courage to see into the lives of others, and only then can we be ready to do everything in our power to improve those lives.

A divided city

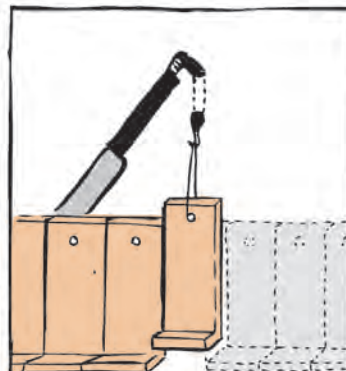
WE ARRIVED AT JERUSALEM ON ROUTE 443, AN ISRAELI MOTORWAY THAT CROSSES PARTS OF OCCUPIED PALESTINIAN TERRITORY. THE WALLS AND WATCHTOWERS ON BOTH SIDES SERVED AS AN INITIATION INTO THIS NEW ENVIRONMENT.



IN 2002, THE ISRAELI GOVERNMENT PASSED A LAW TO CONSTRUCT A SEPARATION WALL INTENDED TO PROTECT ISRAEL FROM POSSIBLE ATTACKS BY PALESTINIAN TERRORISTS.

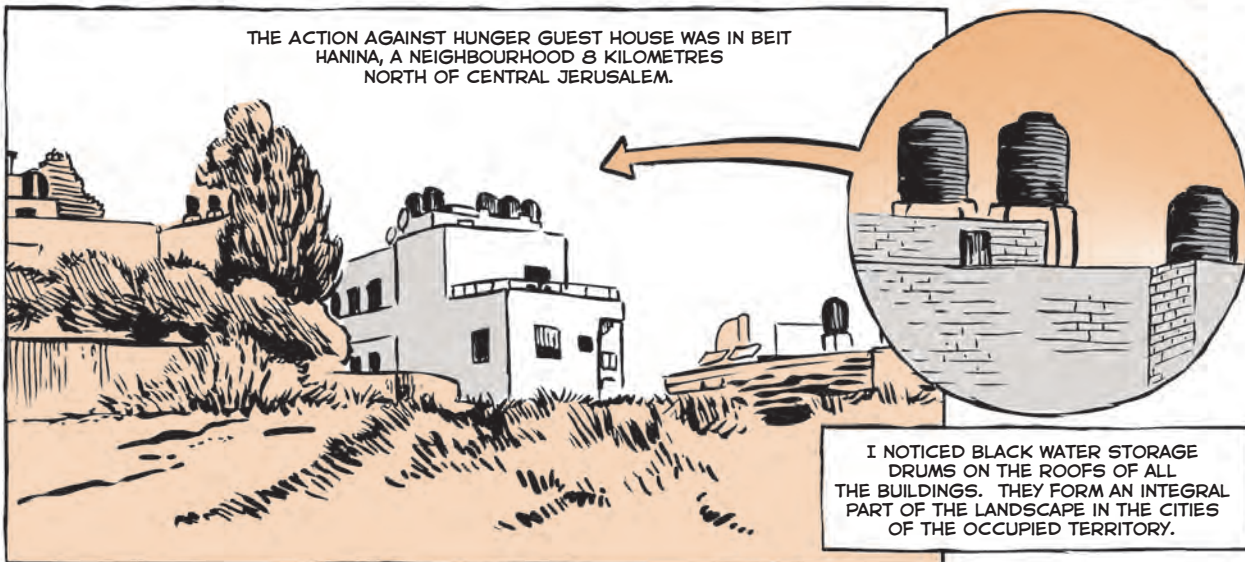


AND SO IT WAS BUILT: COMPLETE WITH ELECTRIC FENCES, DITCHES, BARBED WIRE, SAND STRIPS TO DETECT FOOTPRINTS AND AN ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM.



TWO THIRDS OF THE PLANNED 712 KILOMETRES OF WALL HAVE ALREADY BEEN COMPLETED.

THE ACTION AGAINST HUNGER GUEST HOUSE WAS IN BEIT HANINA, A NEIGHBOURHOOD 8 KILOMETRES NORTH OF CENTRAL JERUSALEM.



I NOTICED BLACK WATER STORAGE DRUMS ON THE ROOFS OF ALL THE BUILDINGS. THEY FORM AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE LANDSCAPE IN THE CITIES OF THE OCCUPIED TERRITORY.

RICARDO, THE ADMINISTRATIVE COORDINATOR FOR ACTION AGAINST HUNGER IN JERUSALEM, WAS WAITING FOR US.



WE LEFT OUR LUGGAGE THERE AND WALKED TO HEADQUARTERS, WHICH WAS JUST FIVE MINUTES AWAY.



WE MET OMAR, WHO GAVE US A BRIEFING ON THE VISIT WE'D BE MAKING TO HEBRON IN TWO DAYS' TIME.

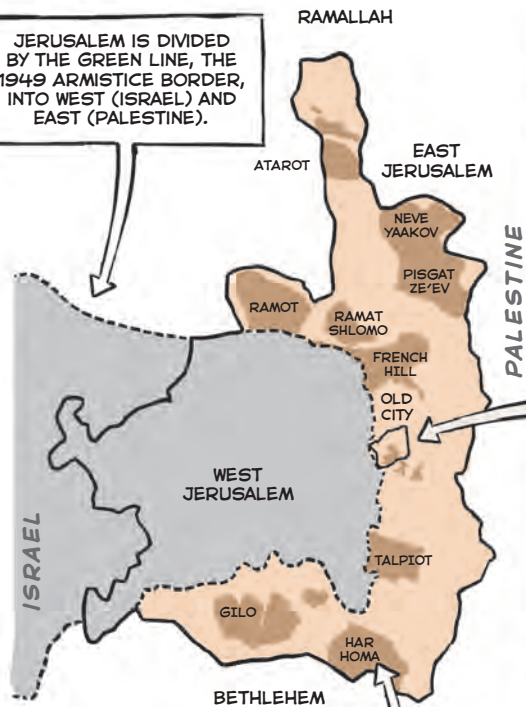

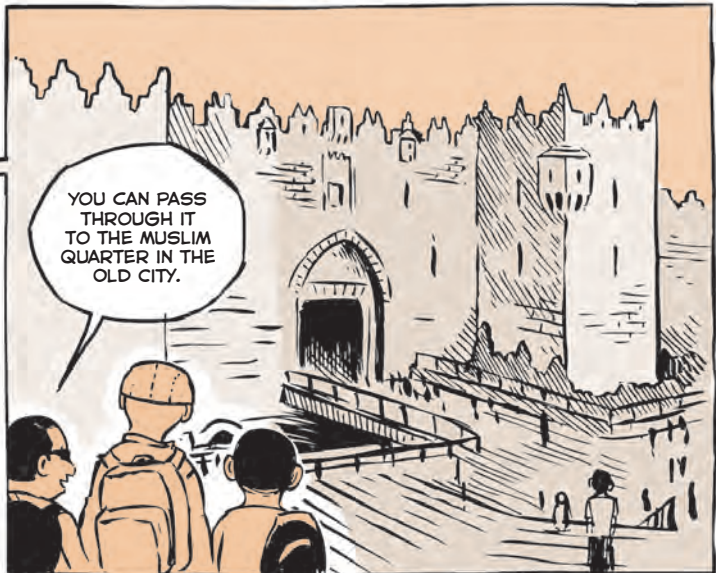

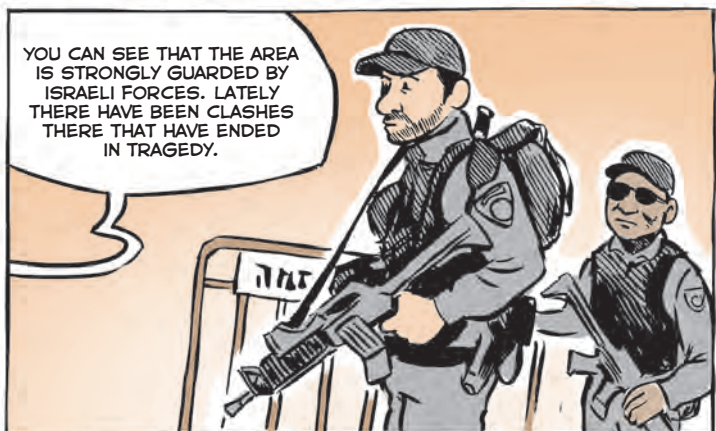


YOU CAN PASS THROUGH IT TO THE MUSLIM QUARTER IN THE OLD CITY.

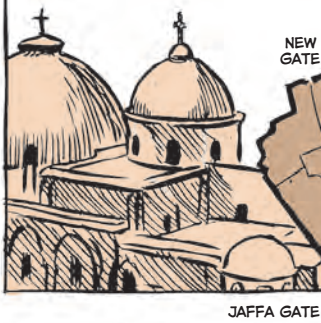

THE OLD CITY IN JERUSALEM HAS BECOME A QUINTESSENTIAL TOURIST ATTRACTION, PACKED WITH SHOPS AND RESTAURANTS. IT IS MADE UP OF FOUR QUARTERS AND COVERS AN AREA OF AROUND ONE SQUARE KILOMETRE.

THE CHRISTIAN QUARTER

...WAS BUILT AROUND THE CHURCH OF THE HOLY SEPULCHRE, AND IS ONE OF THE MOST SACRED PLACES IN CHRISTIANITY. IT IS CONTROLLED BY THE CATHOLIC CHURCH AND THE ARMENIAN APOSTOLIC CHURCH. NOTABLY, THE GREEK ORTHODOX PATRIARCHATE, FRANCISCAN MONASTERY OF ST. SAVIOUR AND LATIN PATRIARCHATE ARE ALSO FOUND HERE.

THE ARMENIAN QUARTER

...WHICH IS ALSO CHRISTIAN, DEVELOPED AROUND THE CATHEDRAL OF ST. JAMES. IT IS A PEACEFUL NEIGHBOURHOOD; ECCLESIASTICAL INSTITUTIONS ARE TUCKED AWAY BEHIND THE HIGH WALLS OF MONASTERIES AND CHURCHES, LENDING THE PLACE AN AIR OF MYSTERY.

THE MUSLIM QUARTER

...DEVELOPED AROUND HARAM AL SHARIF (AL AQSA MOSQUE). THE QUARTER INCLUDES SACRED PLACES THAT ARE RELEVANT TO OTHER RELIGIONS, SUCH AS THE VIA DOLOROSA

FOR CHRISTIANS OR THE KOTEL HAKATAN (OR THE LITTLE WESTERN WALL) WHICH IS HIGHLY FREQUENTED BY ORTHODOX AND ULTRA-ORTHODOX JEWS.

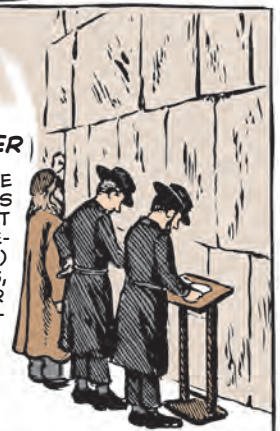

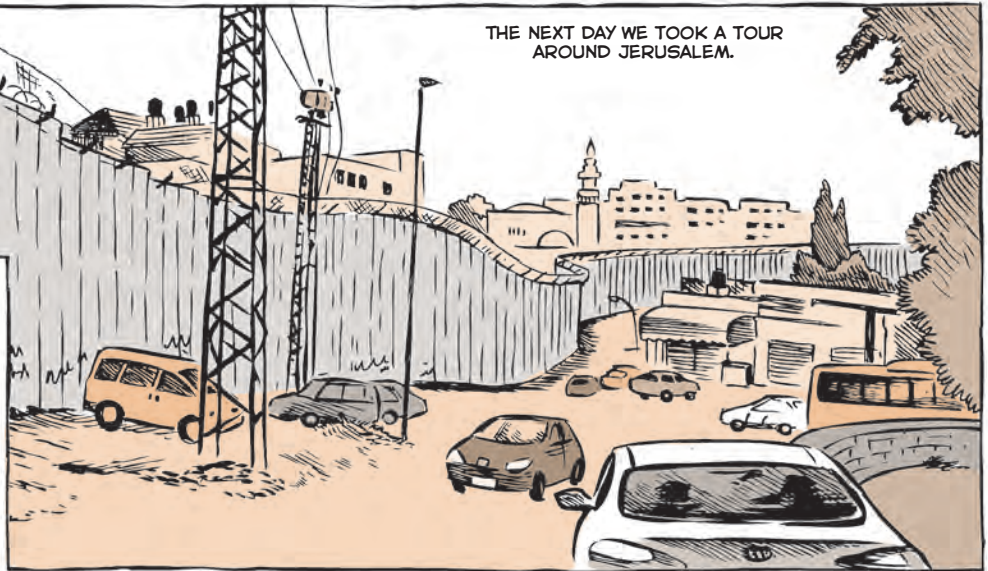

THE NEXT DAY WE TOOK A TOUR AROUND JERUSALEM.

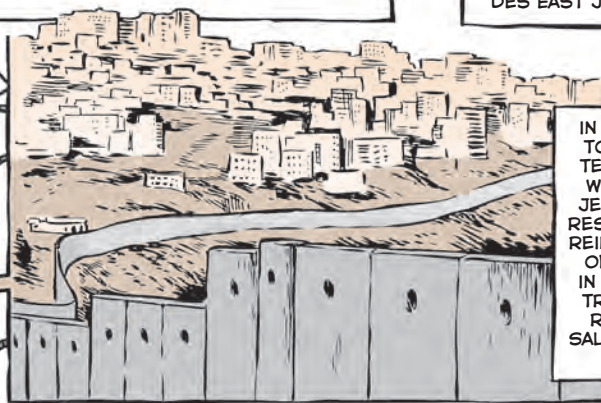
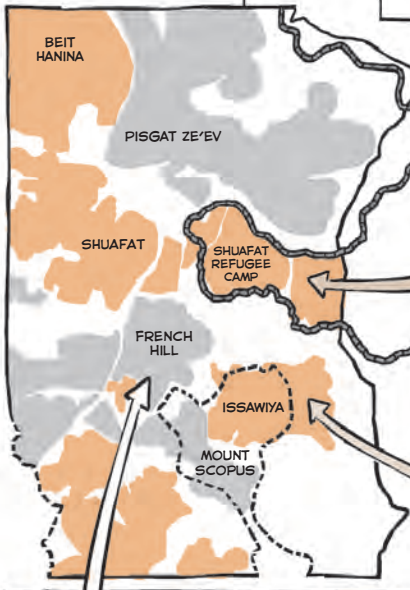

THE SHUAFAT REFUGEE CAMP WAS BUILT IN 1965 TO HOUSE REFUGEE PALESTINIANS IN THE WAKE OF THE 1948 WAR. IT IS LOCATED NEXT TO THE NEIGHBOURHOOD OF SHUAFAT IN EAST JERUSALEM.

IN 1967, AFTER THE SIX DAY WAR, ISRAEL OCCUPIED WEST BANK, WHICH INCLUDES EAST JERUSALEM.

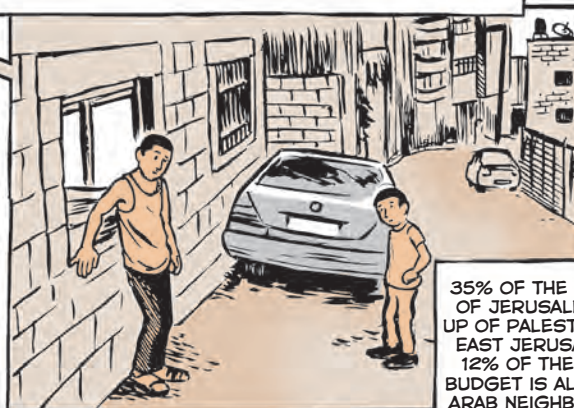


IN 2002 A WALL BEGAN TO GO UP. IT SEPARATED THIS AREA (ALONG WITH OTHERS IN EAST JERUSALEM) FROM THE REST OF THE WEST BANK, REINFORCING THE INTENT OF CERTAIN SECTORS IN THE ISRAELI ADMINISTRATION THAT WISH TO RECLAIM EAST JERUSALEM AS PART OF THEIR TERRITORY.

WE WALKED THE STEEP STREETS OF ISSAWIYA, A FAIRLY RUN-DOWN AND TROUBLED NEIGHBOURHOOD.



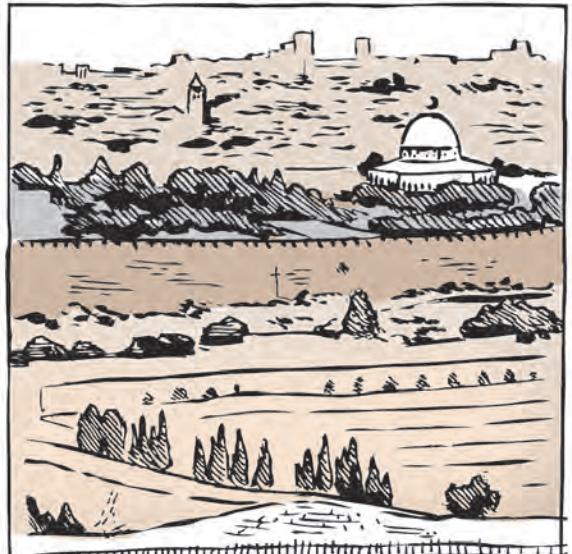
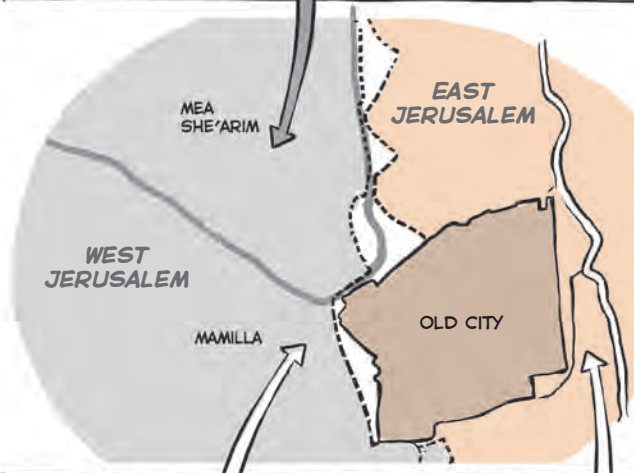
THE FIRST UNIVERSITY OF ISRAEL, THE HEBREW UNIVERSITY, ESTABLISHED ONE OF ITS CAMPUSES NEAR THE FRENCH HILL COLONIAL SETTLEMENT IN MOUNT SCOPUS. THERE ARE WONDERFUL VIEWS OF THE OLD CITY FROM HERE AND YOU CAN EVEN SEE AS FAR AS THE WEST BANK CITY OF BETHLEHEM.



35% OF THE POPULATION OF JERUSALEM IS MADE UP OF PALESTINIANS FROM EAST JERUSALEM; JUST 12% OF THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET IS ALLOCATED TO ARAB NEIGHBOURHOODS.



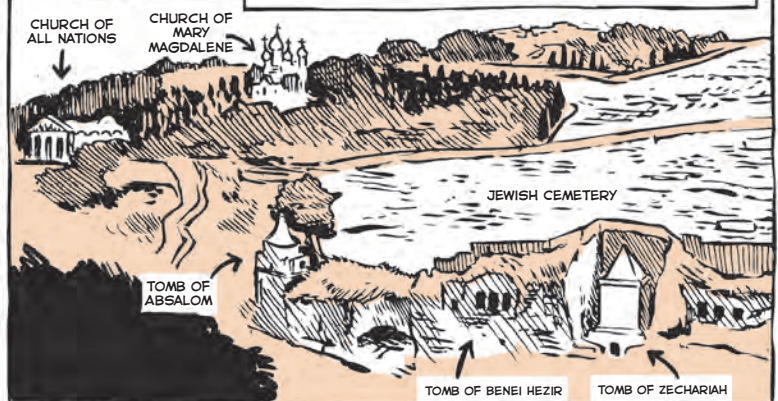
WE WALKED THROUGH THE PICTURESQUE NEIGHBOURHOOD OF MEA SHE'ARIM IN WEST JERUSALEM, WHERE ULTRA-ORTHODOX JEWS LIVE. I THOUGHT WE HAD STEPPED BACK IN TIME BECAUSE OF THE WAY PEOPLE WERE DRESSED.



I ENJOYED ONE OF THE MOST FAMOUS PANORAMIC VIEWS OF THE OLD CITY FROM THE STUNNING JEWISH CEMETERY ON THE MOUNT OF OLIVES.

THEN WE MADE OUR WAY TO THE CITY WALL TO CONTEMPLATE ALL THE MONUMENTS ON THE MOUNT OF OLIVES.

WE ALSO TOOK A STROLL AROUND THE MODERN OPEN-AIR SHOPPING CENTRE IN MAMILLA, WHICH WAS BUILT IN 2007. IT IS TEEMING WITH RESTAURANTS, SHOPS AND ART GALLERIES.



THE OTTOMANS BUILT AN ENTRANCE IN THE RIGHT HAND SIDE OF THE WALL...

HAMID AND OMAR WERE EXCELLENT GUIDES, AND THEY HAD AN INFECTIOUS ENTHUSIASM FOR THE HISTORY OF THEIR CITY.



AS WE RETURNED TO THE OLD CITY THROUGH THE JAFFA GATE, OMAR EXPLAINED HIS RATHER COMPLICATED POSITION AS A CITIZEN.

I HAVE AN IDENTITY CARD FROM JERUSALEM, BUT I'M NOT AN ISRAELI CITIZEN, AND I CAN'T VOTE IN THE ISRAELI GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS.

I HAVE A JORDANIAN PASSPORT, BUT I CAN'T VOTE FOR JORDANIAN PARLIAMENT BECAUSE MY PASSPORT IS JUST TEMPORARY AND I'M NOT A RESIDENT THERE.

I COULD VOTE IN THE GENERAL ELECTION IN PALESTINE, BUT THE LAST ONE TOOK PLACE IN 2006...

MY WIFE IS AN ARAB CITIZEN OF ISRAEL AND HER FAMILY LIVES IN THE WEST BANK...

...ON THE OTHER HAND, I'M PALESTINIAN, I LIVE IN EAST JERUSALEM AND SOME OF MY FAMILY LIVE IN ACRE WHICH IS IN ISRAEL...

...AND I PAY MY TAXES IN ISRAEL.

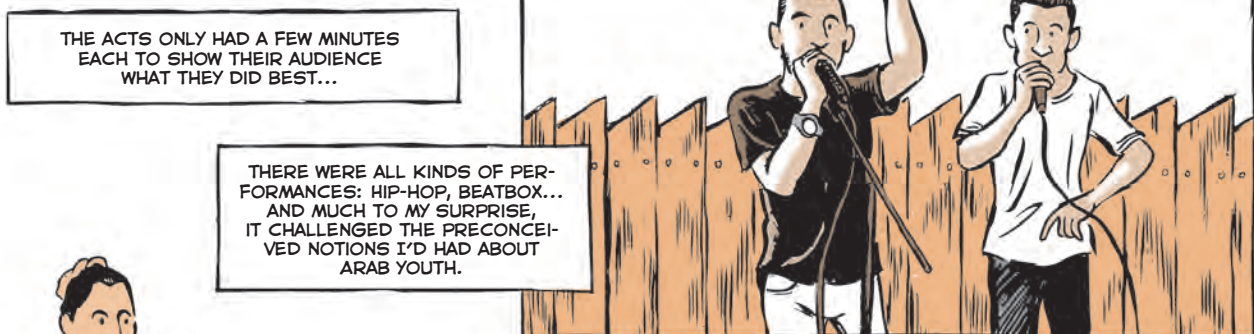
CONFUSING OR WHAT? HE'S LOST ME!

IT WAS OPEN MIC NIGHT, ORGANISED IN THE BASEMENT OF THE AL-MA'MAL FOUNDATION FOR CONTEMPORARY ART.

WE CAN GO TO AN ARMENIAN RESTAURANT NEAR HERE, IF YOU LIKE.

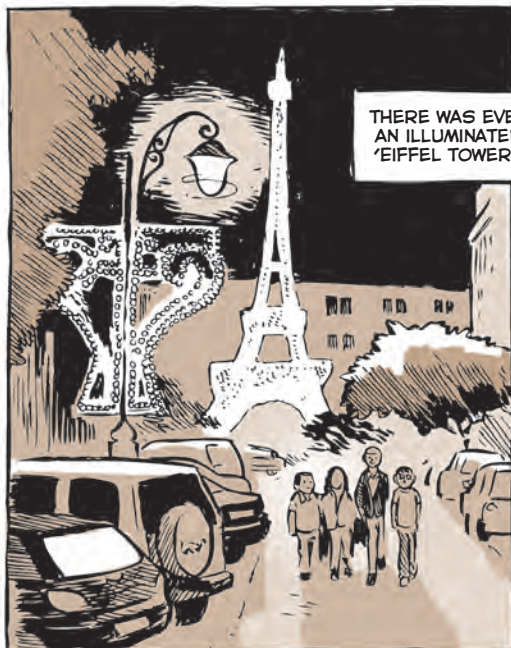


I LOVE FALAFEL! DO YOU KNOW IF IT ORIGINATES FROM ARMENIA?

WE WANDERED THROUGH MAMILLA, A NEIGHBOURHOOD NEAR THE JAFFA GATE. IT WAS A NO-MAN'S LAND SINCE 1948 UNTIL ISRAEL OCCUPIED AND ANNEXED EAST JERUSALEM IN 1967. NOW, WITH ITS OPEN-AIR SHOPPING CENTRE AND RESTAURANTS, MAMILLA WOULD PASS FOR ANY EUROPEAN CITY.

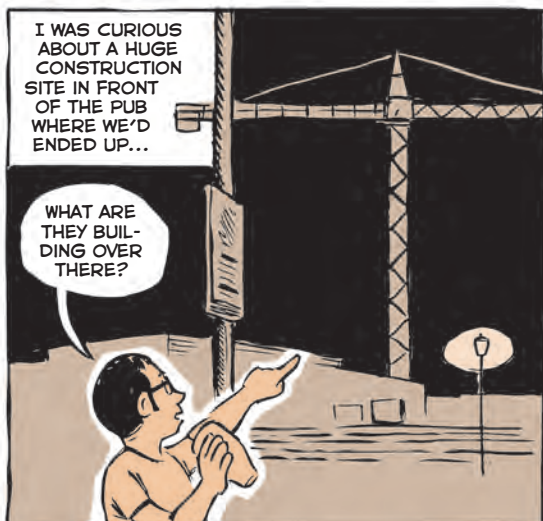


THERE WAS EVEN AN ILLUMINATED 'EIFFEL TOWER'.

THE SITE WAS FOR THE MUSEUM OF TOLERANCE, A LONG-CHERISHED DREAM OF THE ISRAELIS. THE PROJECT HAD SPARKED CONTROVERSY BECAUSE IT WAS BEING BUILT ON THE SITE OF A PROMINENT MUSLIM CEMETERY.

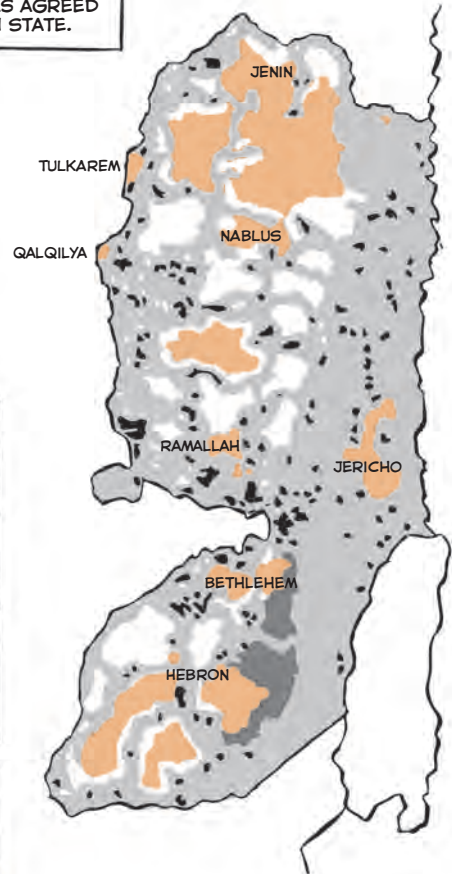
From Hebron to Bethlehem

THE NEXT DAY, WE GOT READY FOR OUR JOURNEY TO AREA C IN HEBRON.

IN 1993 YITZHAK RABIN, BILL CLINTON AND YASSER ARAFAT SIGNED THE OSLO ACCORDS. THREE AREAS WERE ESTABLISHED AND A TRANSITIONAL PERIOD OF FIVE YEARS WAS AGREED FOR NEGOTIATIONS TO BE CONSOLIDATED IN ORDER TO CREATE A PALESTINIAN STATE.



THOSE AREAS WERE INTENDED TO BECOME THE FUTURE INDEPENDENT PALESTINIAN STATE.



AREA A

IS UNDER THE PALESTINE AUTHORITY'S CIVIL AND SECURITY CONTROL AND COMPRISES THE SEVEN MAJOR PALESTINIAN CITIES.

AREA B

IS UNDER THE PALESTINE AUTHORITY'S CIVIL CONTROL AND UNDER ISRAEL'S SECURITY CONTROL.

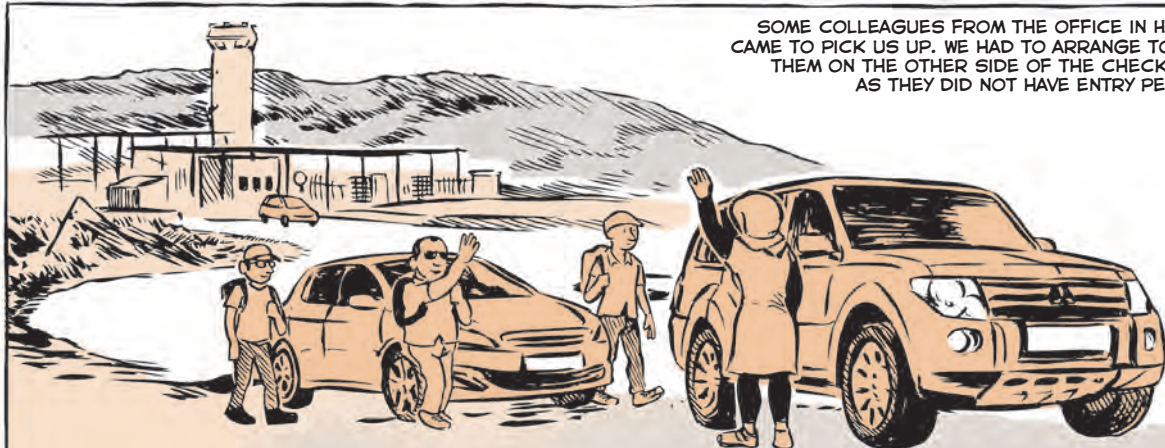
AREA C

IS UNDER ISRAEL'S CIVIL AND SECURITY CONTROL. IT CONSTITUTES AROUND 63% OF PALESTINIAN TERRITORY, AND CONSISTS MAINLY OF RURAL AREAS.

BUT IN THE END, THE INTERIM NATURE OF THAT AGREEMENT WAS NEVER RESOLVED. THE DIVISION CONTINUES TO EXIST TODAY.



SOME COLLEAGUES FROM THE OFFICE IN HEBRON CAME TO PICK US UP. WE HAD TO ARRANGE TO MEET THEM ON THE OTHER SIDE OF THE CHECK-POINT AS THEY DID NOT HAVE ENTRY PERMITS.



THERE ARE TWO TYPES OF NUMBER PLATES IN OCCUPIED PALESTINE:



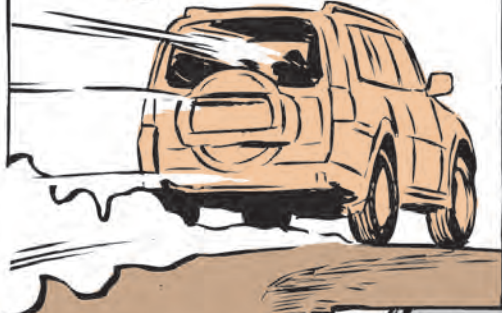
VEHICLES WITH PALESTINE PLATES, SHOWING GREEN NUMBERS ON A WHITE BACKGROUND, ARE NOT PERMITTED TO CIRCULATE INSIDE ISRAEL OR AROUND THE AREAS IN PALESTINE THAT LIE OUTSIDE THE WALL.



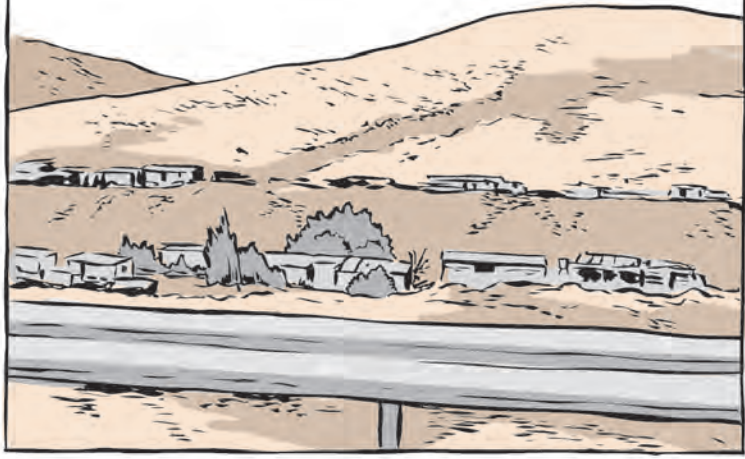
VEHICLES WITH ISRAELI PLATES, SHOWING BLACK NUMBERS ON A YELLOW BACKGROUND, CAN CIRCULATE UNRESTRICTED AROUND ISRAEL AND PALESTINE.

I NOTICED THAT THE NUMBER PLATES ON THE TWO CARS WERE VERY DIFFERENT...

WE WENT TO VISIT THE VILLAGES OF UMM AL-KHAIR AND SUSIYA.



ON THE WAY WE SAW COUNTLESS SHACKS DOTTED AROUND THE SEMI-DESERT HILLS, MANY OF THEM HUDDLED ALONG THE EDGE OF THE MOTORWAY.



OUR COMPANIONS WERE FATMA, HEAD OF FOOD SECURITY AND LIVELIHOOD UNIT...

...AND LUAY, LIVESTOCK EXPERT.

THIS MOTORWAY WAS BUILT BY THE ISRAELI GOVERNMENT TO PROVIDE A LINK TO THE ISRAELI COLONIAL SETTLEMENTS.



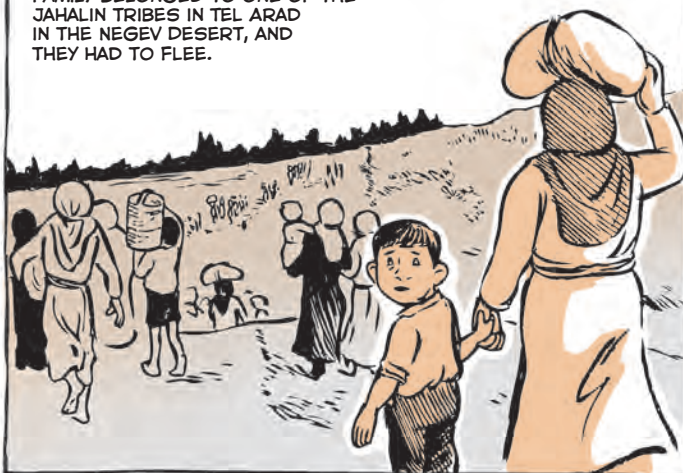
TO OUR LEFT LAY THE MODERN AND COMFORTABLE CHALETES OF CARMEL, SUPPORTED BY ISRAELI GOVERNMENT SUBSIDIES.



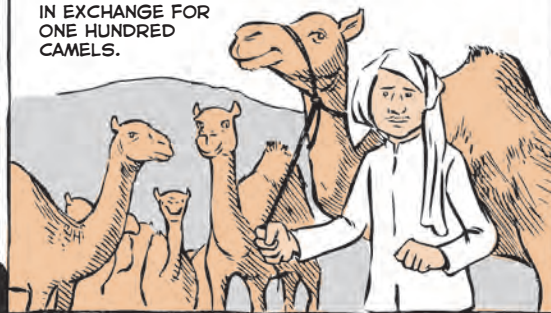
AND RIGHT NEXT TO THAT SETTLEMENT WE FOUND UMM AL-KHAIR, WHOSE PATRIARCH SULEIMAN HATHALEEN CAME TO GREET US WITH ONE OF HIS GRANDSONS.



SULEIMAN WAS JUST EIGHT YEARS OLD WHEN NAKBA, 'THE DISASTER' OCCURRED - IN WHICH INHABITANTS FROM 530 PALESTINIAN VILLAGES WERE FORCIBLY DISPLACED DURING THE 1948 WAR. SULEIMAN'S FAMILY BELONGED TO ONE OF THE JAHALIN TRIBES IN TEL ARAD IN THE NEGEV DESERT, AND THEY HAD TO FLEE.



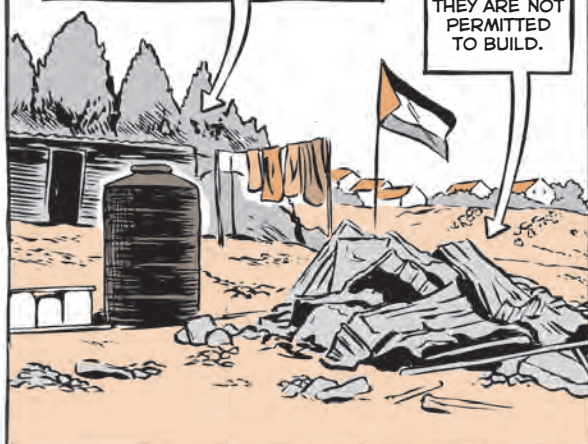
IN 1965 THEY ARRIVED AT THESE LANDS, WHICH THEY BOUGHT FROM THE AUTHORITIES OF YATTA IN EXCHANGE FOR ONE HUNDRED CAMELS.



BUT AFTER THE OSLO ACCORDS, THE MAJORITY OF THOSE LANDS WERE CONFISCATED.



THE COMMUNITY, WHICH IS MADE UP OF FIVE FAMILIES, IS NOW OBLIGED TO LIVE OFF-GRID AND BUY WATER TANKS AT EXORBITANT PRICES.



THEY ARE NOT PERMITTED TO BUILD.

ISRAELI COLONIAL SETTLEMENTS

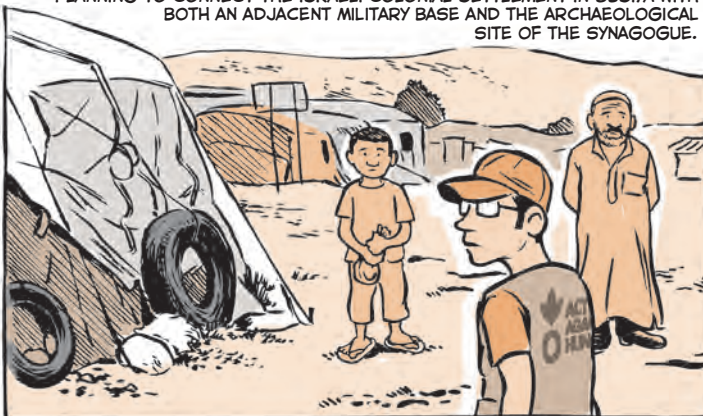


FROM THERE WE WENT DIRECTLY TO THE VILLAGE OF SUSIYA, WHICH IN RECENT YEARS HAS BECOME A SYMBOL OF RESISTANCE FOR THE PALESTINIANS IN HEBRON GOVERNORATE.

THE 450 INHABITANTS LIVING IN SUSIYA ARE MEMBERS OF 47 FAMILIES. THEY ARE SANDWICHED BETWEEN AN ISRAELI SETTLEMENT AND AN ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE, FROM WHICH THE FAMILIES HAD BEEN EXPELLED IN 1986 WHEN THE REMAINS OF A SYNAGOGUE WERE DISCOVERED THERE.



SINCE THEN, THEIR HOUSES HAVE BEEN DESTROYED ON THREE OCCASIONS AND THEY LIVE IN PRECARIOUS HOVELS MADE FROM CANVAS AND PLASTIC, UNDER CONSTANT THREAT OF DISPOSSESSION AND FORCIBLE TRANSFER. ISRAEL IS PLANNING TO CONNECT THE ISRAELI COLONIAL SETTLEMENT IN SUSIYA WITH BOTH AN ADJACENT MILITARY BASE AND THE ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE OF THE SYNAGOGUE.



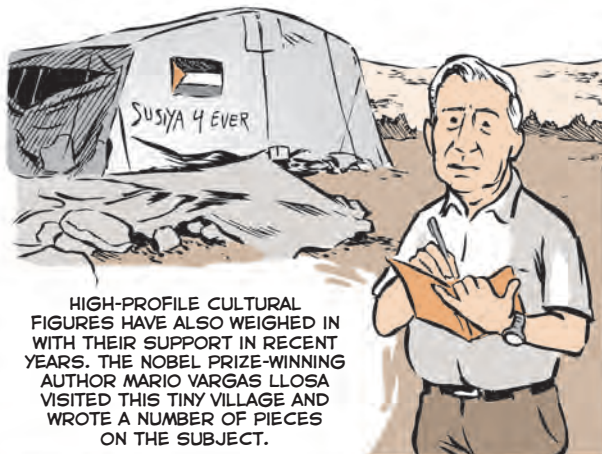
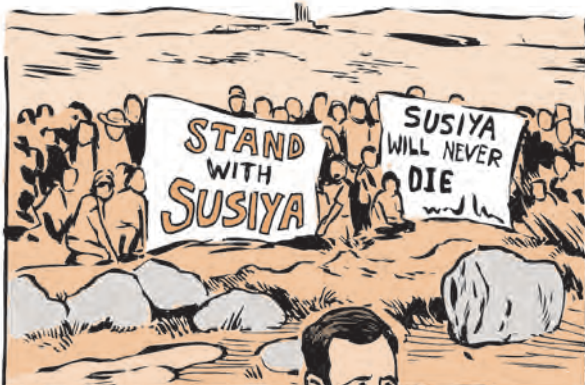
WE ENTERED IN A CONTAINER THAT DOUBLES UP AS THE LOCAL COUNCIL HEADQUARTERS.

EVEN THOUGH WE HAVE THE TITLE DEEDS TO THIS LAND, 80% OF OUR BUILDINGS ARE UNDER A DEMOLITION ORDER.

CIVIL SOCIETY ORGANISATIONS, INCLUDING ISRAELI ONES, ARE HELPING US TO TAKE LEGAL ACTION.



THE SUPPORT PROVIDED BY SOME NGOS AND COUNTLESS ACTIVISTS -PALESTINE, ISRAELI AND INTERNATIONAL ALIKE- HAS PROVED TO BE INSTRUMENTAL IN HALTING THE DEMOLITIONS.



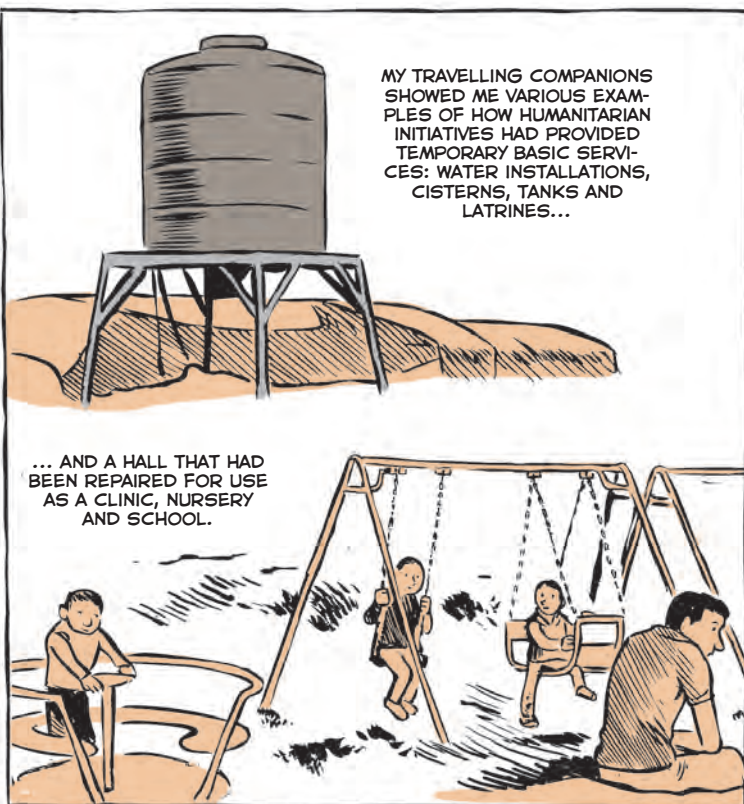
HIGH-PROFILE CULTURAL FIGURES HAVE ALSO WEIGHED IN WITH THEIR SUPPORT IN RECENT YEARS. THE NOBEL PRIZE-WINNING AUTHOR MARIO VARGAS LLOSA VISITED THIS TINY VILLAGE AND WROTE A NUMBER OF PIECES ON THE SUBJECT.

DEMOLITION OF SUSIYA WOULD BE HARMFUL AND PROVOCATIVE. WE URGE ISRAELI AUTHORITIES TO WORK WITH THE RESIDENTS OF THE VILLAGE TO FINALIZE A PLAN THAT ADDRESSES THE RESIDENTS' HUMANITARIAN NEEDS.

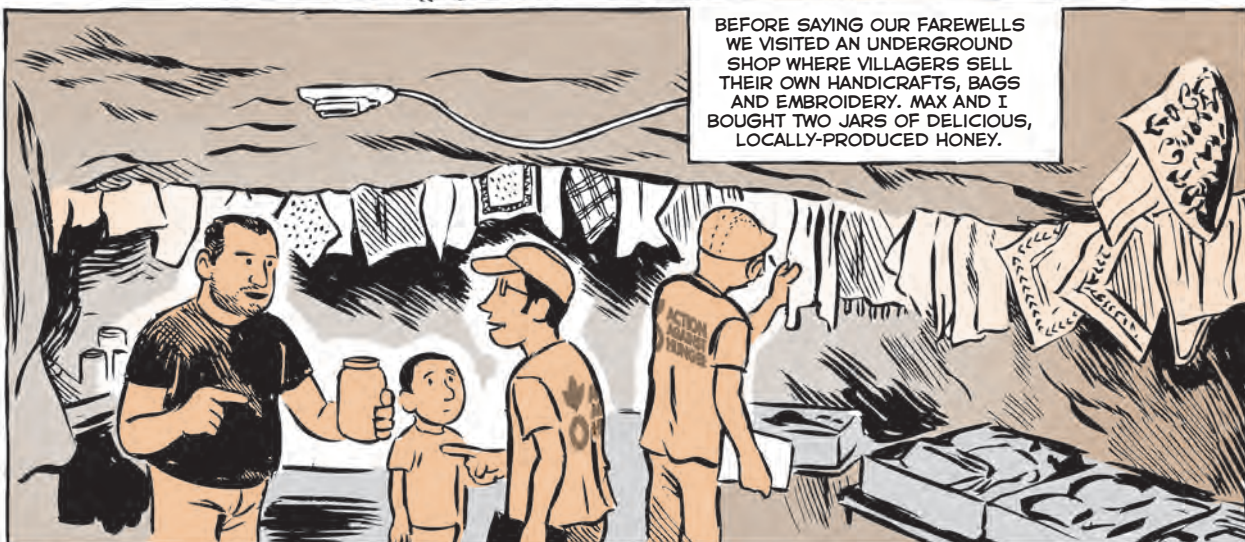
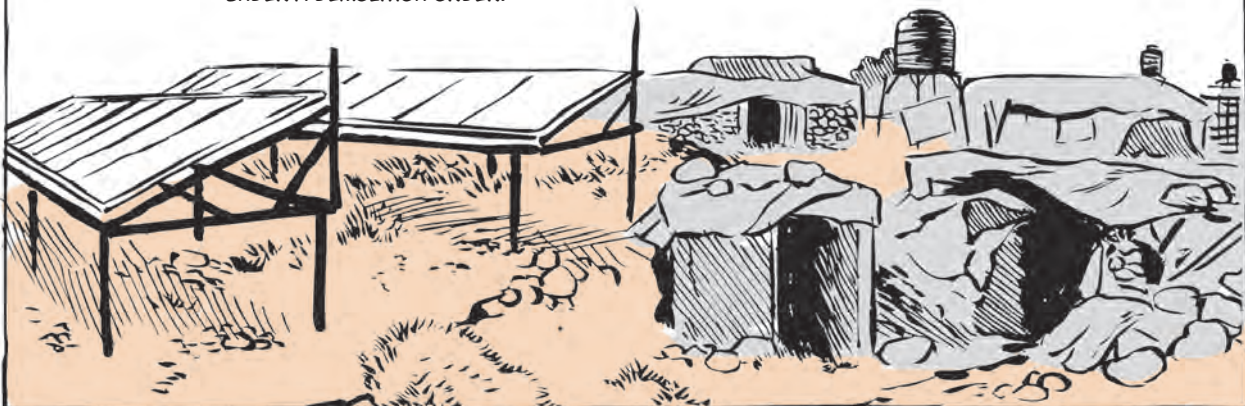

... AND A HALL THAT HAD BEEN REPAIRED FOR USE AS A CLINIC, NURSERY AND SCHOOL.

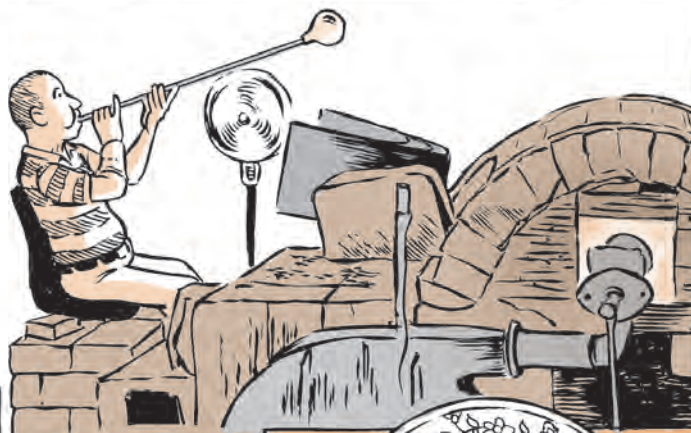
THESE SOLAR PANELS, THE ONLY SOURCE OF ENERGY FOR THE VILLAGE, WERE FINANCED BY EUROPEAN GOVERNMENTS. THE PANELS ARE NOW UNDER A DEMOLITION ORDER.



BEFORE SAYING OUR FAREWELLS WE VISITED AN UNDERGROUND SHOP WHERE VILLAGERS SELL THEIR OWN HANDICRAFTS, BAGS AND EMBROIDERY. MAX AND I BOUGHT TWO JARS OF DELICIOUS, LOCALLY-PRODUCED HONEY.



ON OUR ARRIVAL IN HEBRON, WE MADE A STOP AT A PHOENICIAN POTTERY WORKSHOP TO PICK UP A SOUVENIR. I NEVER HAD THE CHANCE TO SEE A GLASS-BLOWER AS THE TRADE HAS ALMOST DISAPPEARED IN MY OWN COUNTRY.



WE WERE SURPRISED BY THE FACT THAT A SIGNIFICANT PROPORTION OF THE GOODS WAS AIMED AT THE ISRAELI MARKET.



FOR DINNER WE HAD MANSAF, A TYPICAL BEDOUIN DISH. IT'S A RICE BROTH WITH GOAT YOGHURT COVERED WITH PIECES OF LAMB, ON A BREAD BASE.



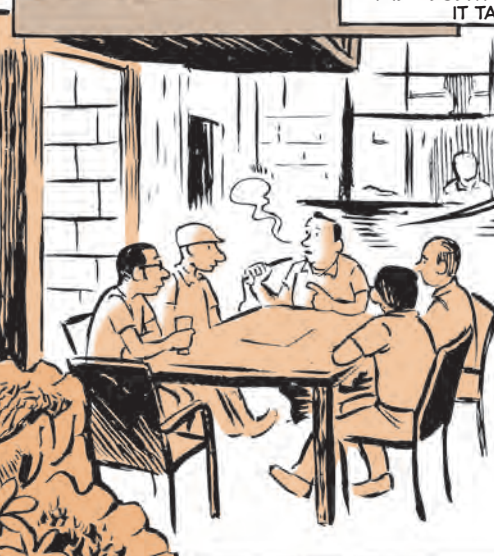

AHMED, HEAD OF ACTION AGAINST HUNGER IN HEBRON, HAD JOINED US FOR DINNER. DURING OUR AFTER-DINNER CHAT HE EXPLAINED THAT A 'BATTLE' OF DEMOGRAPHICS HAD BEEN WAGED FOR DECADES.



A FAMILIAR SIGHT IN ARAB TOWNS: EVEN THOUGH IT WAS VERY LATE, SHOPS AND STALLS WERE STILL OPEN FOR BUSINESS.



IT WAS THE EVE OF RAMADAN. THE STREETS WERE DECKED WITH BRIGHT LIGHTS SIMILAR TO CHRISTMAS DECORATIONS.

AFTER THE SIX-DAY WAR IN 1967, VARIOUS FUNDAMENTALIST JEWISH GROUPS WANTED TO STOP THE OCCUPIED TERRITORY FROM BEING RECLAIMED. THEY BEGAN TO OCCUPY MORE PARTS OF THE CITY.



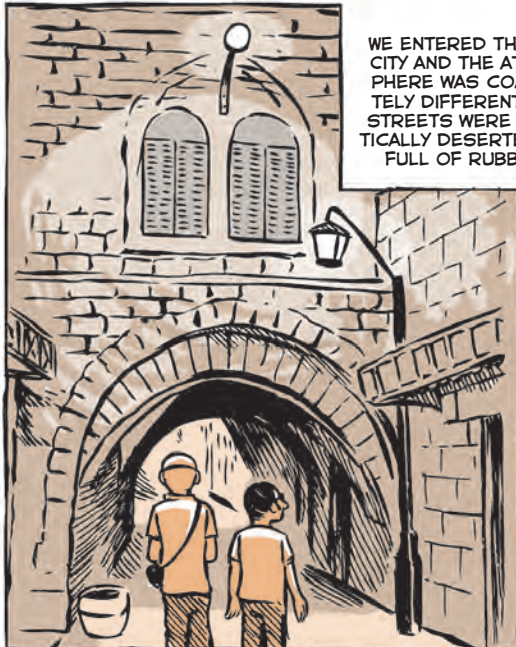
AFTER DECADES OF TENSIONS, THE HEBRON PROTOCOL WAS SIGNED IN 1997. IT WAS PART OF A TEMPORARY MEASURE INTENDED TO MITIGATE CONFLICT IN THE AREA. HEBRON WAS CONSEQUENTLY SPLIT IN TWO: ZONE H1, UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE PALESTINIAN NATIONAL AUTHORITY, AND ZONE H2, UNDER ISRAELI MILITARY CONTROL.



HEBRON IS THE ONLY CITY IN PALESTINE WITH ISRAELI COLONIAL SETTLEMENTS IN ITS CENTRE. OF ITS 200,000 INHABITANTS, AROUND 40,000 PALESTINIANS LIVE WITH 400-850 ISRAELI SETTLERS IN THE OLD CITY.



8,000 MORE ISRAELIS LIVE IN THE KIRYAT ARBA SETTLEMENT, ON THE OUTSKIRTS OF HEBRON.



WE ENTERED THE OLD CITY AND THE ATMOSPHERE WAS COMPLETELY DIFFERENT. THE STREETS WERE PRACTICALLY DESERTED AND FULL OF RUBBISH.



MANY PALESTINE BUSINESSES ARE OBLIGED TO CLOSE; OTHERS OPERATE UNDER RESTRICTED HOURS TO AVOID PROBLEMS WITH THE ISRAELI SETTLERS WHO LIVE ABOVE. AND IN SOME AREAS, OVERHEAD WIRE GRILLES AND NETTING PROTECT PASSERS-BY FROM THE RUBBISH THAT IS THROWN OUT.

THE NEXT MORNING WE RETURNED TO JERUSALEM WITH FARID, PROJECT MANAGER FOR WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WASH).



WE GRABBED THE CHANCE TO MAKE A STOP IN BETHLEHEM.



I SAW THE CHURCH OF THE NATIVITY, WHICH HAD BEEN CONSTRUCTED UPON THE SPOT BELIEVED TO BE CHRIST'S BIRTHPLACE.



WE WERE STILL DOING THE TOURIST THING AND WENT SOUVENIR HUNTING...

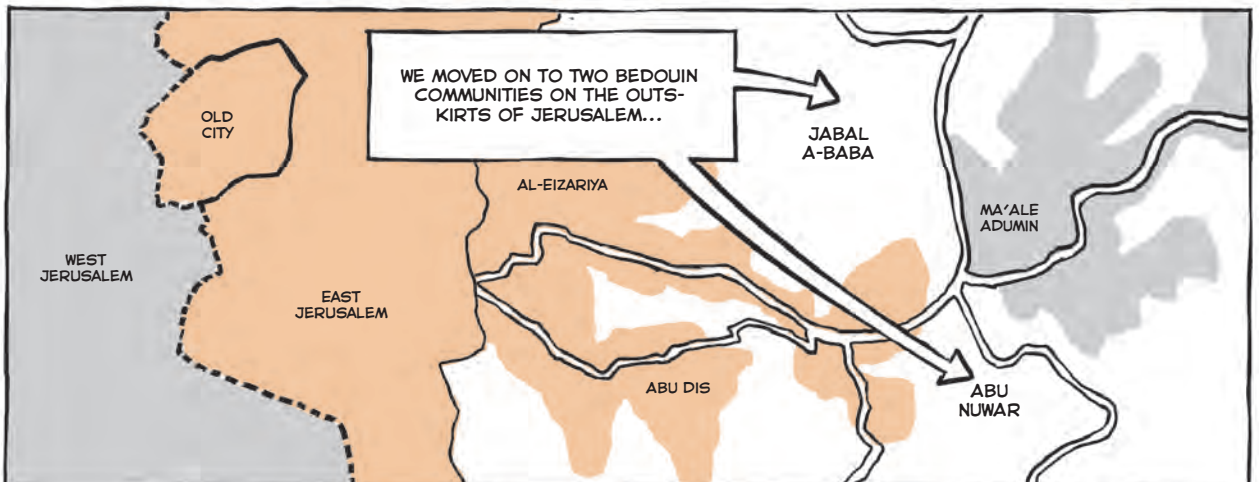

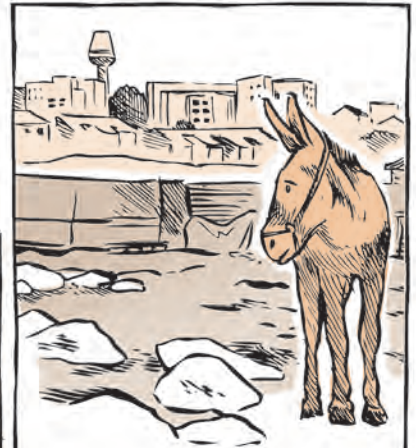
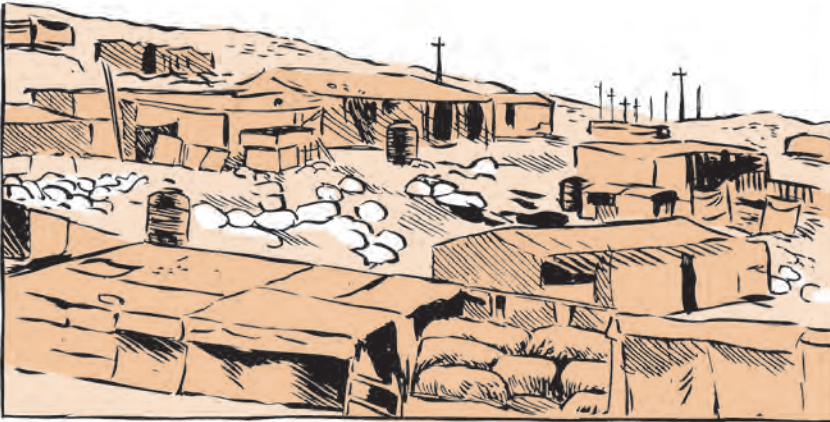




A VIEW FROM THE EAST

Near Jerusalem

ABU NUWAR IS THE LARGEST BEDOUIN COMMUNITY IN EAST JERUSALEM. MORE THAN 700 OF ITS INHABITANTS COME FROM 113 FAMILIES. THEY ARRIVED HERE IN 1967 AFTER THE SIX-DAY WAR. THROUGHOUT 1997-1998, AND AGAIN IN 2005, DEMOLITION ORDERS WERE ISSUED FOR EVERY BUILDING IN THE COMMUNITY.

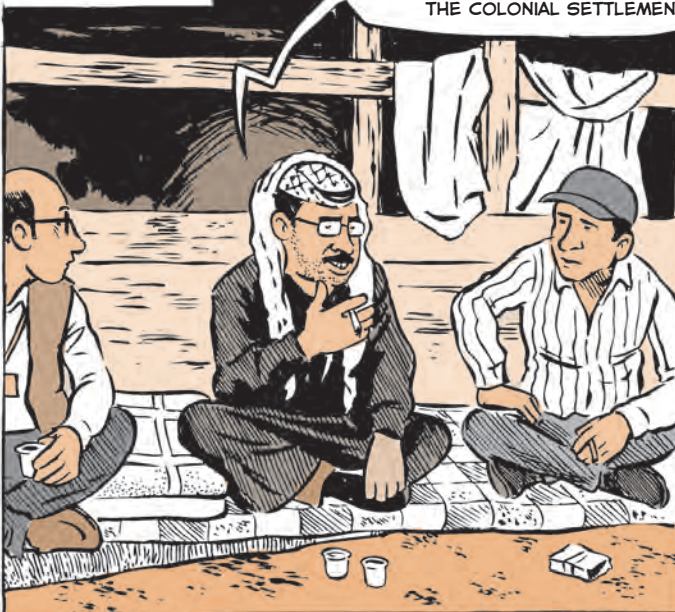


THE ORDERS WERE NOT CARRIED OUT, BUT THE INHABITANTS WERE FORBIDDEN FROM BUILDING ANYTHING AT ALL. THE LANDSCAPE IS MADE UP OF FLIMSY HUTS MADE OF WOOD, TIN, AND STRIPS OF RAGS AND PLASTIC.

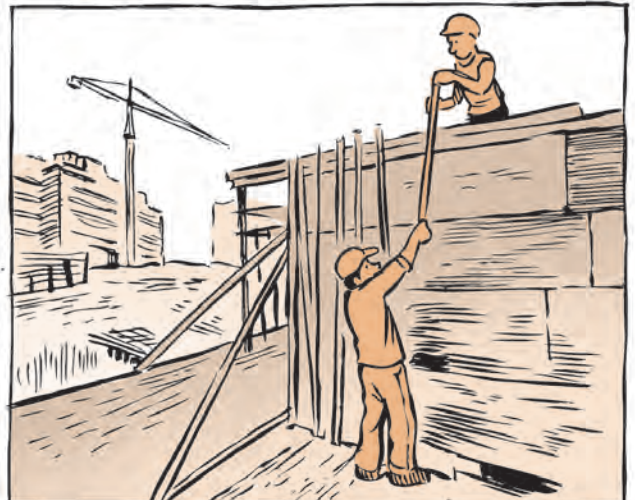
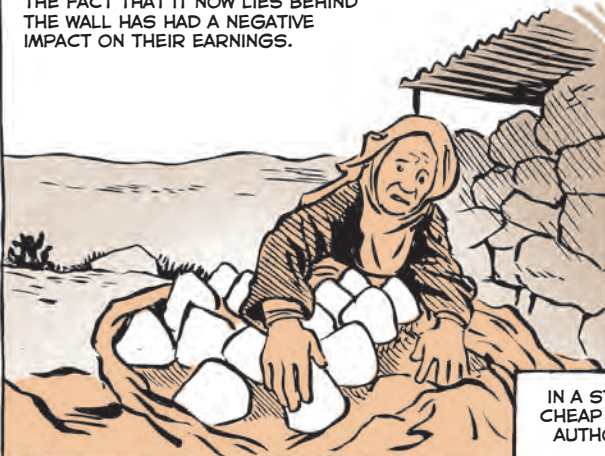

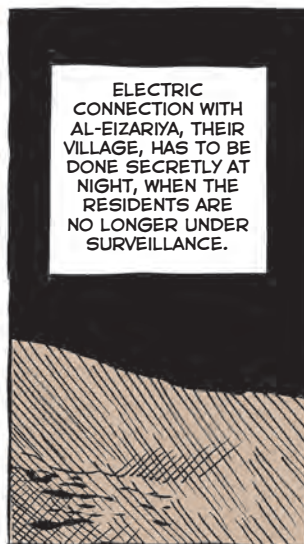
THE RESIDENTS MAKE DAIRY PRODUCTS FOR SALE AND BARTER. IN FACT, THEY CAN ONLY DISTRIBUTE THOSE PRODUCTS VIA PUBLIC TRANSPORT AND PRIVATE CARS TO ABU DIS AND AL-EIZARIYA. THEY CANNOT SELL IN EAST JERUSALEM AS THEY HAD DONE IN THE PAST; THE FACT THAT IT NOW LIES BEHIND THE WALL HAS HAD A NEGATIVE IMPACT ON THEIR EARNINGS.



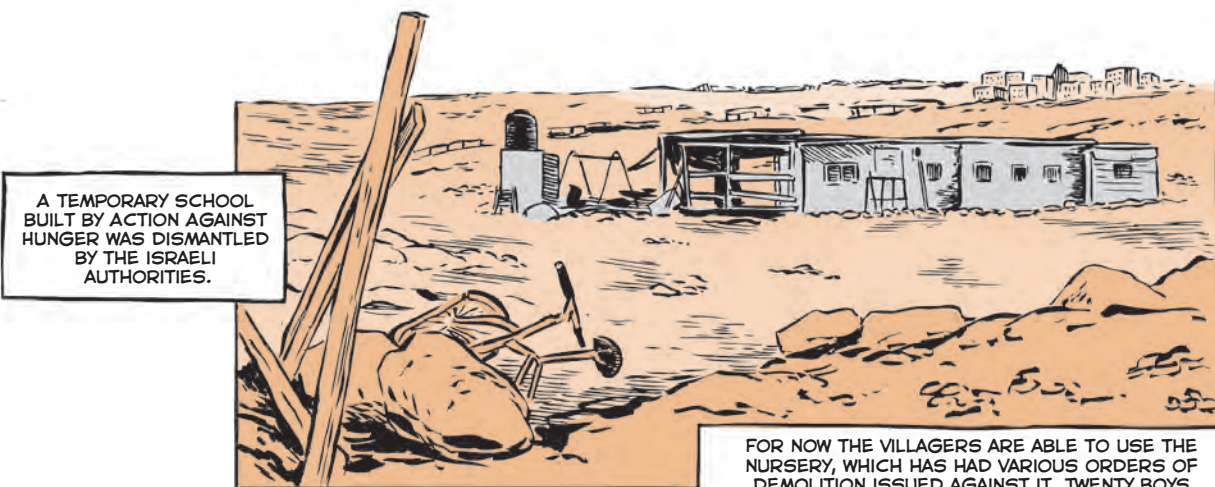
IN A STRANGE PARADOX, MANY RESIDENTS HAD ORIGINALLY WORKED AS CHEAP LABOUR IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF SETTLEMENTS. TODAY, ISRAELI AUTHORITIES NO LONGER APPROVE THE MAJORITY OF WORK PERMITS. THE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE HAS REACHED 80%.



JUST LIKE THE OTHER 'UNRECOGNISED VILLAGES' IN AREA C, BEDOUIN COMMUNITIES ON THE PERIPHERY OF JERUSALEM ARE DENIED ACCESS TO A POWER SUPPLY, IN SPITE OF THE HUGE HIGH-VOLTAGE PYLONS THAT TOWER ABOVE THEM.



ELECTRIC CONNECTION WITH AL-EIZARIYA, THEIR VILLAGE, HAS TO BE DONE SECRETLY AT NIGHT, WHEN THE RESIDENTS ARE NO LONGER UNDER SURVEILLANCE.



A TEMPORARY SCHOOL BUILT BY ACTION AGAINST HUNGER WAS DISMANTLED BY THE ISRAELI AUTHORITIES.

FOR NOW THE VILLAGERS ARE ABLE TO USE THE NURSERY, WHICH HAS HAD VARIOUS ORDERS OF DEMOLITION ISSUED AGAINST IT. TWENTY BOYS AND GIRLS ATTEND SCHOOL THERE.

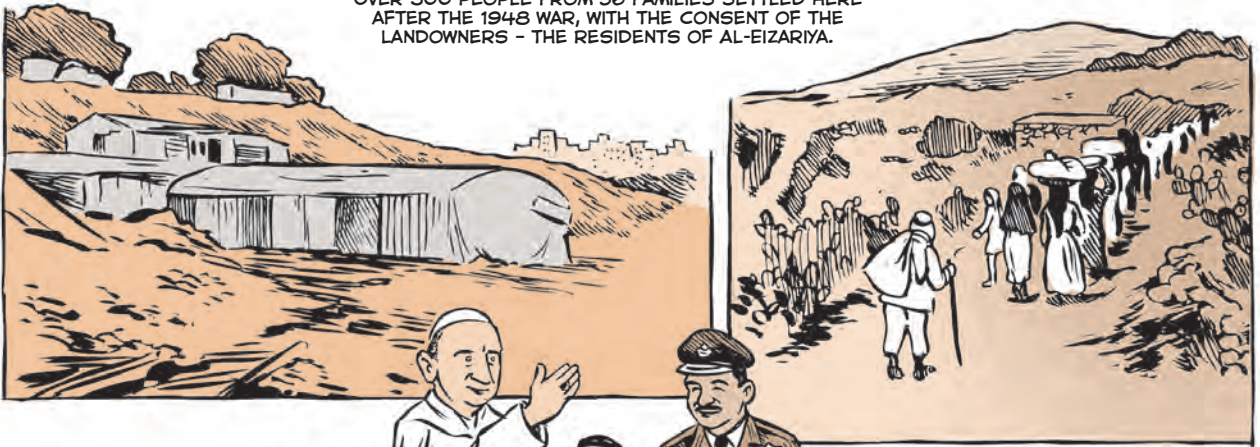


THE RESIDENTS OWN AROUND 3,000 HEAD OF OVINE AND CAPRINE LIVESTOCK. THE ANIMALS GRAZE BY A RIVER CLOSE TO THE LARGEST RUBBISH DUMP IN THE WEST BANK IN AL JABAL, EAST OF ABU DIS.



IN FACT THIS PLACE, CLOSE TO WHERE RUBBISH IS BURIED, IS THE PROPOSED SITE FOR THE RELOCATION OF THE ABU NUWAR BEDOUINS. OTHERS WERE DISPLACED THERE IN 1997. THE DUMP GIVES OFF AN UNPLEASANT SMELL PARTICULARLY AT NIGHT, WHICH CAUSES RESPIRATORY PROBLEMS AMONGST THE POPULATION.

JABAL AL-BABA IS ANOTHER POPULATION UNDER THREAT. OVER 300 PEOPLE FROM 56 FAMILIES SETTLED HERE AFTER THE 1948 WAR, WITH THE CONSENT OF THE LANDOWNERS - THE RESIDENTS OF AL-EIZARIYA.



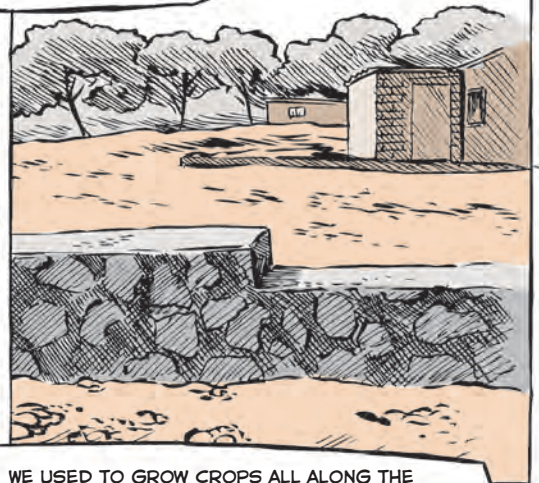

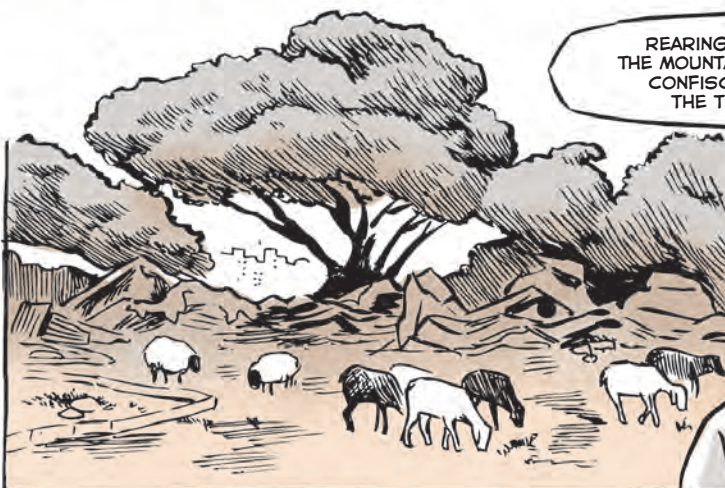
WE SPOKE TO ATALLAH MAZARAA, THE COMMUNITY REPRESENTATIVE.

IN 1982 THEY CUT OUR ACCESS TO WATER FROM AL-EIZARIYA AND BUILT A WALL AROUND THE MOUNTAIN. THEY TRIED TO SHUT THE COMMUNITY OFF COMPLETELY, BUT WE MANAGED TO STOP THEM AND THEY LEFT US ONE SMALL ENTRANCE.



WE USED TO GROW CROPS ALL ALONG THE RIVERBED SLOPES, BUT THE BARRIER HAS MADE THAT IMPOSSIBLE NOW.

REARING LIVESTOCK IS OUR MAIN SOURCE OF INCOME. THE MOUNTAIN HAS MANY NATURAL RESOURCES, BUT THEY'VE CONFISCATED LARGE AREAS OF PASTURE AND LIMITED THE TERRITORY WHERE OUR ANIMALS CAN GRAZE.

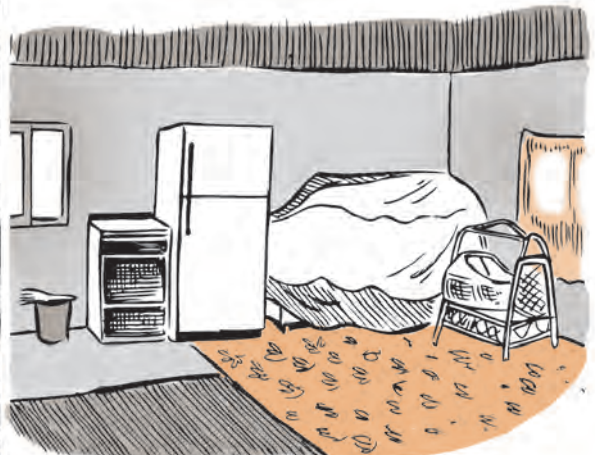


THE RATE OF UNEMPLOYMENT HERE IS EXTREMELY HIGH, THE SAME AS IN ABU NUWAR, BECAUSE THEY'VE STOPPED GIVING OUT WORK PERMITS.

IN SPITE OF THESE TOUGH CONDITIONS, THE COMMUNITY FIGHTS TO MAINTAIN THEIR TRADITIONAL LIFESTYLE AND STAY ON THE MOUNTAIN. THEY DON'T WANT THEIR CHILDREN TO BE LEFT WITH NOWHERE TO LIVE.

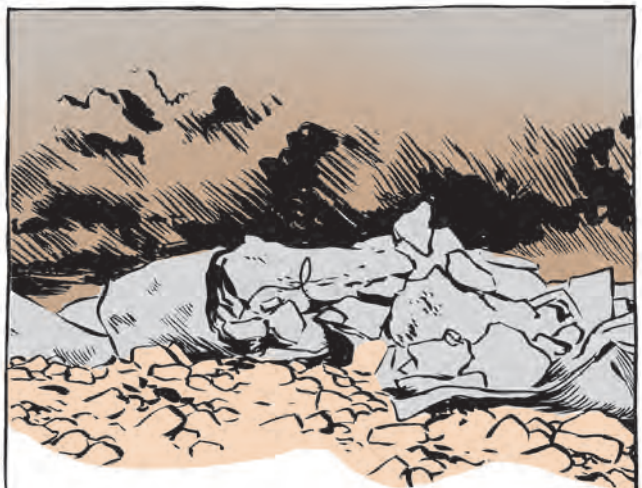

ON OUR OUTINGS WE'D SEE INCREDIBLE PHOTOGRAPHIC MONTAGES PRINTED ON POSTERS OR HUGE CANVASES. WE GUESSED THAT THESE WERE IMAGES OF PEOPLE CONSIDERED AS MARTYRS.



NABLUS PRODUCES ITS OWN 'NABULSI' SOAP, MADE WITH OLIVE OIL, WATER AND SODIUM. ONE OF THE OLDEST INDUSTRIES IN THE WORLD, THE ORIGINS OF THIS PARTICULAR SOAP GO BACK AS FAR AS THE 10TH CENTURY.

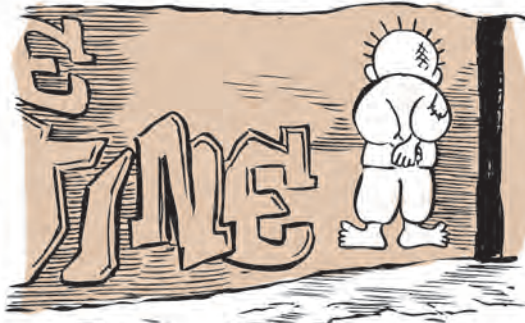

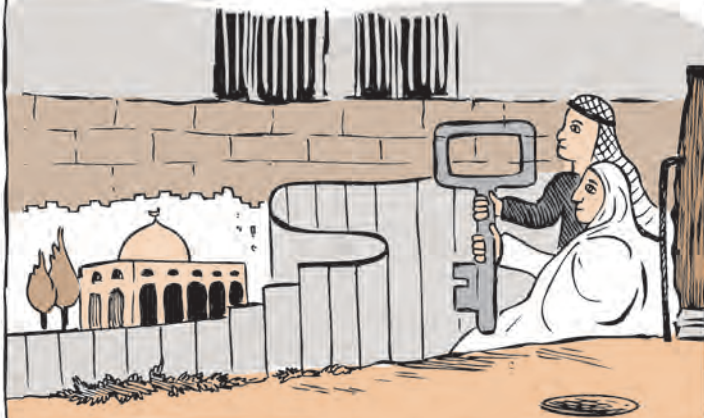

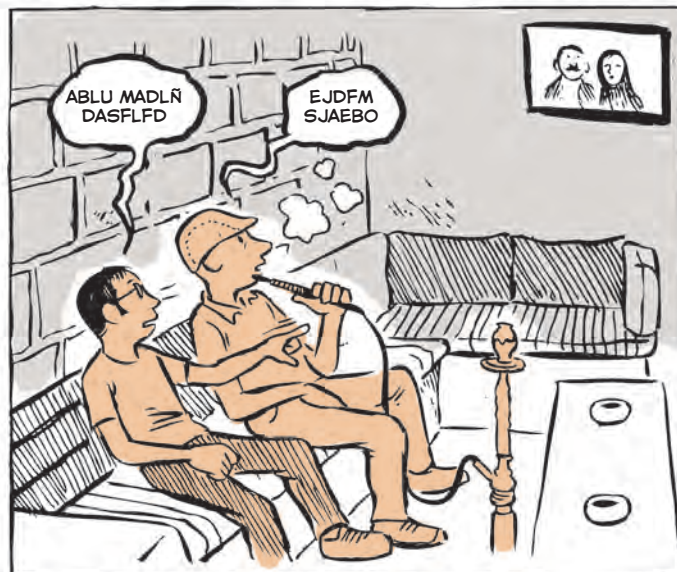

HANDALA IS ONE OF THE MOST DEFINITIVE ICONS, PRESENT IN MANY STREETS THROUGHOUT THE OCCUPIED TERRITORY. HE WAS CREATED IN 1969 BY A REFUGEE CARTOONIST TO EMBODY THE ABSOLUTE DISPOSSESSION HE WAS EXPERIENCING. HANDALA REPRESENTED THE IDEA THAT HE COULD NOT GROW UP OR TURN AROUND UNTIL HE COULD RETURN TO HIS HOMELAND. IT WAS NEVER TO BE.



THE KEY OF RETURN IS ANOTHER OF THE GREATEST SYMBOLS FOR PALESTINIANS. MANY REFUGEES STILL KEEP THE KEYS FROM THE HOUSES THAT THEY HAD TO LEAVE NEARLY 70 YEARS AGO, ALWAYS IN THE HOPE THAT THEY WILL ONE DAY RETURN.

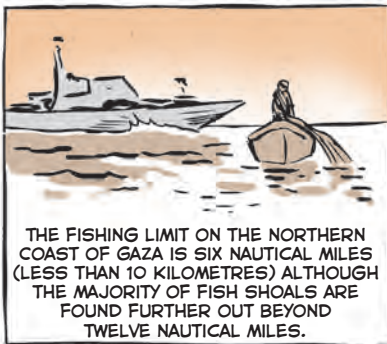
THE NEXT DAY WE MADE OUR WAY TO THE GAZA STRIP.



LITTLE DID WE GUESS AS WE CONTEMPLATED THE IDYLIC LANDSCAPE AROUND THE YAD MORDECHAI KIBBUTZ, THAT ONE OF THE MOST DISTURBING PLACES IN THE WORLD WAS JUST THREE KILOMETRES AWAY.



THE GAZA STRIP HAS ONE OF THE HIGHEST CONCENTRATIONS OF POPULATION IN THE WORLD: 1,900,000 PEOPLE LIVE ON A TERRITORY 365 SQUARE KILOMETRES IN SIZE. GAZANS HAVE SUFFERED A BLOCKADE FOR NEARLY 10 YEARS AND GONE THROUGH THREE MAJOR WARS SINCE 2008, THE MOST RECENT ONE IN 2014.



THE FISHING LIMIT ON THE NORTHERN COAST OF GAZA IS SIX NAUTICAL MILES (LESS THAN 10 KILOMETRES) ALTHOUGH THE MAJORITY OF FISH SHOALS ARE FOUND FURTHER OUT BEYOND TWELVE NAUTICAL MILES.

WATER IS A HUGE EXPENDITURE FOR HOMES; FOR MANY, THE COST EATS INTO ONE THIRD OF THE FAMILY BUDGET.

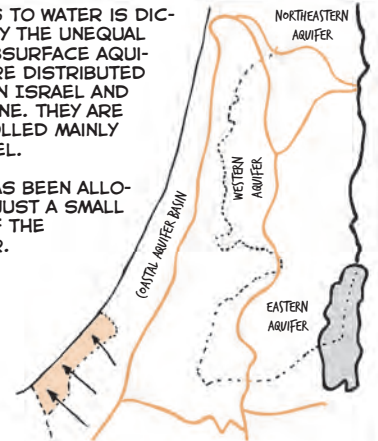

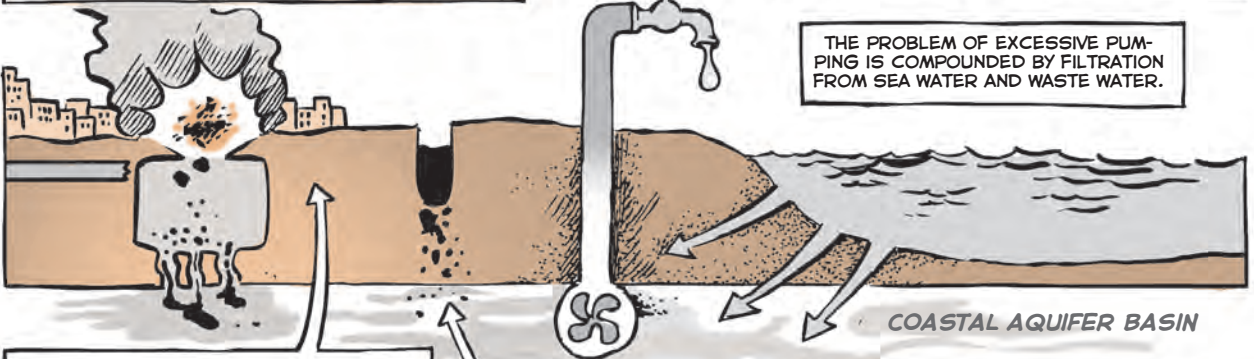

GAZA HAS BEEN ALLOCATED JUST A SMALL PART OF THE AQUIFER.



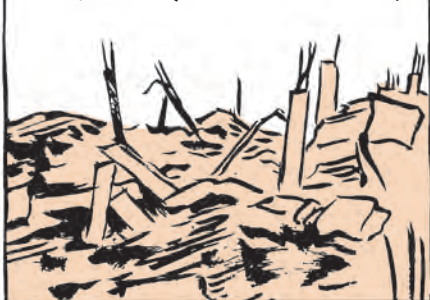

THE WAR WRECKED DAMAGE ON THE WATER INFRASTRUCTURE AT AN ESTIMATED COST OF \$34 MILLION (AROUND £27.5 MILLION).

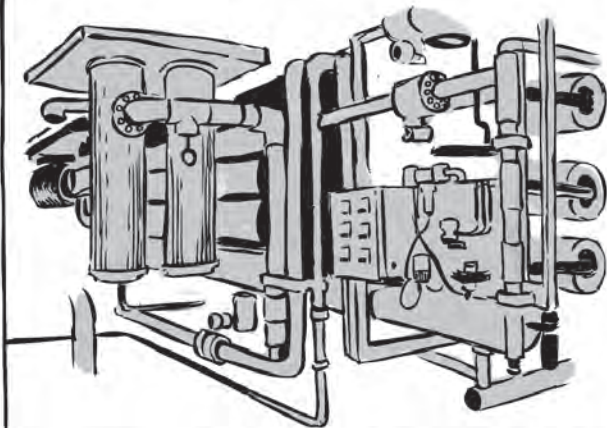


60% OF THE POPULATION HAS NO ACCESS TO A SEWERAGE SYSTEM. THEY USE CESSPITS TO THROW AWAY WASTE WATER AND RAW SEWAGE. THIS CONTAMINATION ALSO EVENTUALLY FILTERS THROUGH TO THE AQUIFER.



CESSPITS ARE SOURCES OF DISEASE, PUTRID SMELLS AND MOSQUITOES. THERE ARE MILLIONS OF PITS IN GAZA. EVERY MONTH THEY OVERFLOW, AND DESLUDGING TRUCKS ARE CALLED IN TO EMPTY THEM.

THERE ARE CURRENTLY JUST THREE OPERATIONAL SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANTS IN GAZA. THE EQUIPMENT IS OBSOLETE AND WORKS INEFFICIENTLY BECAUSE OF THE POWER CUTS.

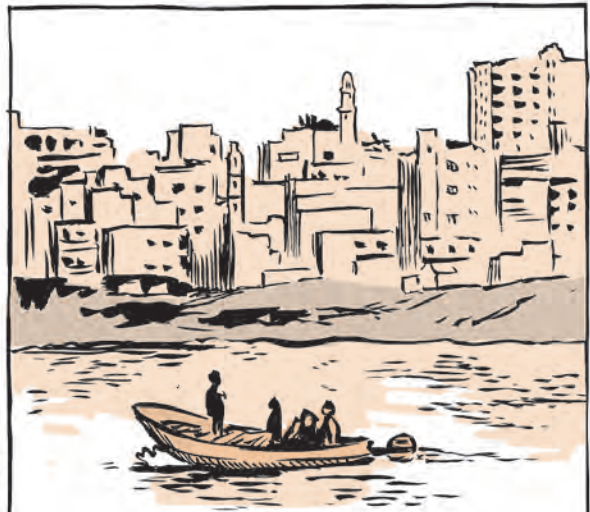


THE BLOCKADE RESTRICTS IMPORTS OF VITAL MATERIALS SUCH AS GENERATORS, FUEL, AND CHEMICAL PRODUCTS, AND LIMITS ENTRY INTO GAZA BY EXPERTS WHO COULD PROVIDE A SOLUTION TO THE PROBLEM.



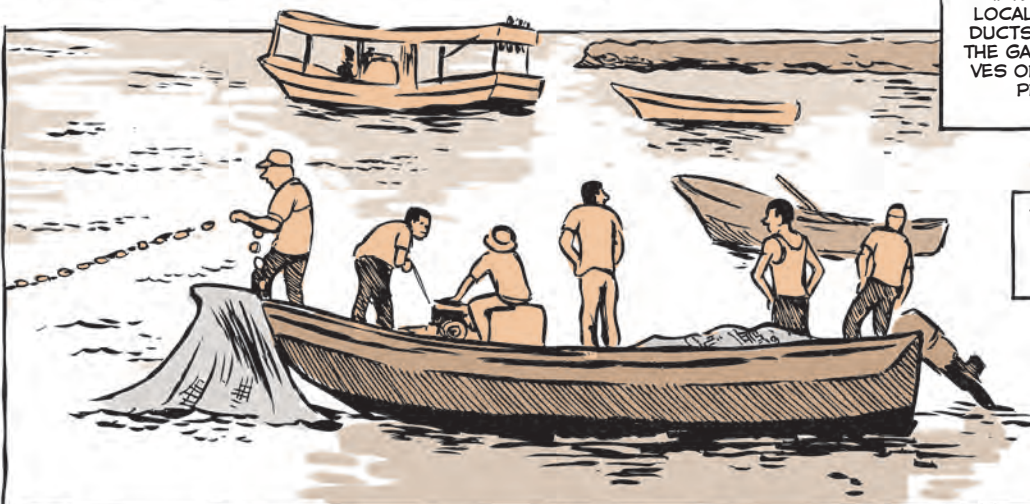
RESTRICTIONS ON THE INSTALLATION OF SOLAR PANELS LIMIT THE USE OF RENEWABLES THAT COULD BE USED TO PROCESS WASTE WATER.

AS A CONSEQUENCE OF AN INADEQUATE SEWERAGE SYSTEM AND LACK OF FUEL FOR EQUIPMENT, 100,000 CUBIC METERS OF PARTIALLY TREATED WATER FLOW INTO THE MEDITERRANEAN SEA EVERY DAY. GRADUALLY THE SMELL BECOMES INTOLERABLE.



52% OF THE STRIP'S 42 KILOMETRES OF COAST IS SEVERELY POLLUTED AND 90% IS NOT SUITABLE FOR BATHING.

THIS HAS A VERY SERIOUS IMPACT ON THE FISHING INDUSTRY. OVER HALF OF THE 4,000 FISHERMEN IN GAZA LIVE BELOW THE POVERTY LINE*, BECAUSE MARINE LIFE CANNOT SURVIVE IN SUCH A POLLUTED ENVIRONMENT.



THE CONTAMINATED WATERS MAKE THE LOCAL FISHERY PRODUCTS UNDESIRABLE. THE GAZANS THEMSELVES OPT FOR ISRAELI PRODUCTS.

THE SAME SITUATION APPLIES TO IRRIGATION AND AGRICULTURE.

* THERE IS, APPARENTLY, ONLY ONE FISHERWOMAN IN GAZA.

AROUND 70% OF RAINWATER IS LOST DOWN THE DRAIN. THE LACK OF AN ADEQUATE INFRASTRUCTURE FOR HARVESTING RAINWATER IS CONTRIBUTING TO ENVIRONMENTAL DEGRADATION.



THE REMAINING WATER TRIGGERS FLOODS IN WHICH CLEAN WATER MIXES WITH OVERFLOWING SEWAGE.

SAMER SHOWED US SEVERAL JOINT INITIATIVES BEING UNDERTAKEN WITH THE COASTAL MUNICIPALITIES WATER UTILITY (CMWU) AND THE PALESTINIAN WATER AUTHORITY (PWA). THESE ENTITIES PROVIDE PUBLIC SERVICES, SANITATION AND HYGIENE, AND THEY ARE IN CHARGE OF TECHNICAL DESIGN AND COORDINATION WITH NGOS.

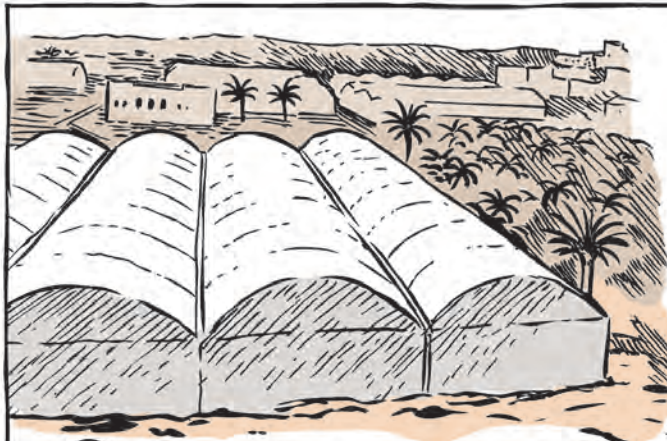

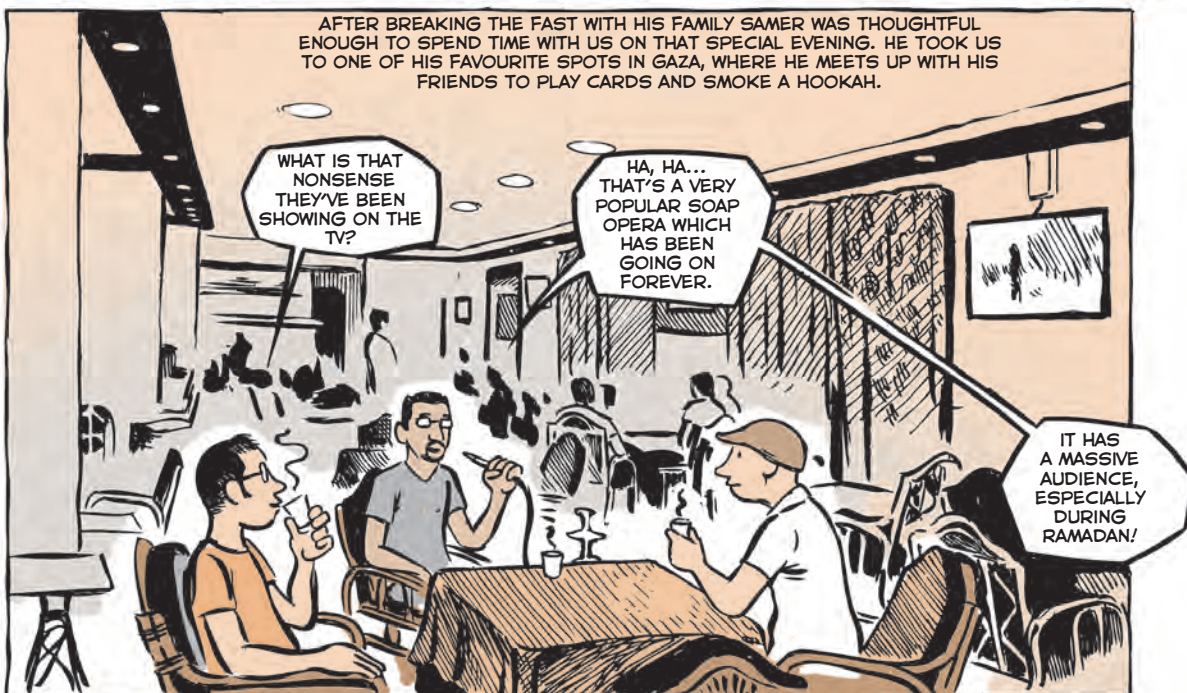
CHILDREN PLAYED IN THE STREET, SWINGING SPONGES ON FIRE TIED ONTO STRINGS.
